'HENRY V' COMES TO EUROPA WINERY

William Shakespeare's "Henry V" has taken the stage at Europa Village Winery, 33475 La Serena Way, running through July 26, as part of Shakespeare in the Vines' ninth season.

"I was a theater and music teacher for 28 years, and I always wanted to do Shakespeare by the ocean somewhere," said Sheila Havens Ryle, the theater group's artistic director and founder, of her motivation to create a non-profit theater company. "We moved inland, and we were driving through wine country one day and [I thought] what a perfect setting among the vines, drinking wine. Shakespeare would have loved it."

"Henry V" director Patrick Walsh was approached by Ryle to bring the historical work to the Vines. Walsh said he cut some of the original scenes to produce a two-hour performance.

"'Henry V' is the historical reinterpretation by Shakespeare of the Battle of Agincourt between the French and the English," Walsh said. "For English people seeing it in 1599, it was a sense of pride for them because they were outnumbered six to one by the French and they managed to win. It's really a play about Henry and his journey to becoming a good and fair leader. His father actually usurped the throne so Henry had to live under that shadow of his father's decision for almost his entire reign but through that, he actually became a very well-

connected king and leader." Another adaptation Walsh made to the play was to create a "feeling of ensemble" by interspersing all of the lines of the character known as the "chorus" throughout the entire 12-member cast.

"What I'm really interested in exploring is the creation of an entire world through language," Walsh said. "The set itself will be covered with words from the play, while the costumes are of period. The focus is on the ensemble and the creation of the play with this group of individuals, who are working incredibly hard to bring [the community] an amazing production."

The original play had 41 parts. In Walsh's version, actors will be doubling and tripling their roles. "Henry V" cast members include: Zack Bonin, Marissa Matson, Allen Riedel, John Montano, Bill Becker, Carissa Leigh, Russell Biggeman, Billy Clebick, Françoise Renet, Michael Guccione, Beau Allen and Bobbi Hedlund.

Chairs are provided by the winery, but guests are encouraged to bring blankets.

"There is nothing more magical than watching outstanding theater under the moon and stars amidst the beautiful vineyards of Temecula Valley wine country," Ryle said in an email. "Last year, over 3,000 patrons attended our productions."
